SACP Launches The People's Red Caravan to Drive Grassroots Development and Socialism in Practice, in Motlhabe Village.

The South African Communist Party (SACP), led by General Secretary Comrade Solly Mapaila, officially launched *The People's Red Caravan*—a nationwide initiative grounded in the theme: "The People's Movement for Self-Reliance and Sustainability."

This campaign marks a major step in the SACP's commitment to grassroots development and deepening the Party's ties with communities. The Red Caravan will serve as a dynamic platform for mobilising the working class, advancing local democratic power, and promoting socialist values through practical, community-based action.

Building Socialism from the Ground Up

The rollout took place in Motlhabe Village, where the SACP and local community members collaborated on a week-long programme of high-impact development projects. These included:

The week concluded with a well-attended Community Imbizo at the community hall. The SACP officially handed over the completed projects to the Motlhabe community in a ceremony led by Kgosi Nyalala Pilane and members of the Bakgatla-ba-Kgafela traditional authority. Also in attendance were Kgosi Mabalane, Deputy Chairperson of the North West House of Traditional and Koi-San Leaders, and North West MEC for Agriculture and Rural Development, Mr. Madoda Sambatha and members of the royal family.

Focusing on Critical Needs

The Red Caravan initiative targets key areas vital to sustainable rural development and community empowerment, including:

- Food security, food sovereignty, and local food production
- Public health, education, and community safety
- Arts, culture, and recreational activities
- Infrastructure improvements: water, sanitation, and access roads
- Economic self-reliance through revitalised, community-based productive activities

Through these efforts, the SACP demonstrates a practical and people-centred vision for socialism—one rooted in everyday life and community solidarity. This is what building socialism looks like—hands-on, people-led, and driven by the working class.
